- 2003**  
Prosecutor A. D'Alterio elected the first EJTN Secretary General.
- 2005**  
EJTN establishes a permanent Secretariat in Brussels.
- 2006**  
The EC entrusted EJTN to implement exchanges between judicial authorities.
- 2007**  
A Council Decision recognises that EJTN serves a genuine European interest in training the EU judiciary.
- 2008**  
EJTN signs MoU's with ECtHR & EUROJUST.
- 2010**  
Criminal I training and eLearning programmes launched.
- 2011**  
Linguistics & Civil Law training programmes launched.
- 2013**  
First operating grant awarded to EJTN under the EU Justice Programme & EC confirms its central role in judicial training.
- 2014**  
The Council of the EU recognises EJTN's fundamental importance within the sphere of European judicial training.

10th anniversary of EJTN's Exchange Programme & THEMIS Competition.
- 2016**  
EJTN adopts its Judicial Training Principles, providing a framework for judicial training in Europe and signs an MoU with the CJEU.

EJTN's Conference of Directors in Vienna drafts its Strategic Plan 2021-2027.
- 2019**  
EJTN Strategic Plan 2021-2027 adopted.

EJTN celebrates its 20th anniversary amid the COVID-19 health crisis.

Integration of judicial staff started and EJTN accepts its first Associate Members.

Launch of the Judges@Europe initiative & Western Balkans II Project.
